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



The cost to mail will be \$6.50. (\$5.00 for the fat quarter (see challenge rule below), and \$1.50 for shipping).

2021 Hernando Quilt Guild Challenge

Home Sweet Home

One of our favorite quilt blocks is the house pattern. Since the pieced block is technically simple, there is ample opportunity for experimentation. Our theme for 2021 is Home Sweet Home. Let your imagination run wild! Build your entry around the house of your dreams, the house of your childhood, a holiday house (don't get stuck on the standards – think about "Take your Pet to the Vet Day", Ground Hogs Day, Arbor Day, National Donut Day, etc.). How about your favorite house to visit, a haunted house or even your "today" house? Feel free to add activities, landscaping, pets, automobiles, hobbies, flora, fauna and/or other embellishments. You may use a purchased pattern, design one of your own, or use one of the blocks suggested by the committee. Don't limit yourself to a quilt or a wall hanging. Perhaps a pillow or a bag or a fabric basket.

As part of the challenge each participant must purchase a fat quarter of "Home Again Houses" fabric for \$5.00 as an entry fee (see Pam Russavage or Shirley Kerstetter). This fabric must be visibly incorporated into the quilt top, although it's not necessary to use the entire fat quarter. To reclaim your entry fee, you must turn in your project for display and judging at the end of the challenge. Any entry fee not reclaimed will be donated to the guild to be used in one of its charities.



Categories: Entries will be judged in one category.

Judging: We will again try to bring in an outside judge who will choose "Best of Show", 1st place, 2nd place, and 3rd place. Guild members will vote for the winner of "Viewer's Choice".

Composition: You must have the fabric "Home Again Houses" visibly included on the quilt top.

Quilting: You must have hand or machine quilting on your entry.

Size: No smaller than 16X16 and no larger than 45x60. If your entry is smaller or larger than the specifications, **your entry will not be judged**.

Due Date: February 25, 2021 – Guild Meeting

Rules: You are not allowed to use a project that has been made previous to this challenge. It must be made between March 26, 2020 and February 24, 2021. There will be a sign-up sheet when you turn in your entry. You must label the back of your entry with your name and the entry title.



Beginning Of Barn Quilts



<u>Barn Quilts: The Beginning</u>

Barn Quilts Started with Donna Sue Groves in 2001. Contrary to common myth, Donna Sue was not a renown Amish quilter from generations past, but a contemporary quilter in Adams County, Ohio. Donna Sue, being the sweetheart she was, wanted to create a project to honor her mother, Maxine, and her Appalachian heritage.

She decided to use her biggest, most visible canvas: the side of her barn. She partnered with some local artists to create not only a quilt block on her own barn, but a completed "sampler" of twenty quilt blocks, encouraging people to follow the trail and travel through the beautiful Ohio countryside.

The project was a homey, heartwarming success, and Donna Sue was asked by other quilt enthusiasts, artists, and historians to help develop quilt trails in their states as well.

Tennessee, Iowa and Kentucky were the first to jump onboard, all eager to take pride in their networks of old barns, and their rich cultural histories. Now, you can run into quilt trails in rural areas all around the country, each with their own unique symbols and stories.

Modern Barn Quilt Squares with Historic Significance

Bear's Paw: Early American Pioneers coming across a bear track would know that they needed to proceed cautiously, but that the bear's tracks would lead to water and food.

Bow Tie: Though it may symbolize morning, midday, evening, and night, this pattern also reminds us of the bow ties that were given to many slaves running toward freedom as part of a disguise.

Flying Geese: Also a signal for slaves intending to escape, this pattern was a reminder to follow the direction of the geese also headed North.

<u>Rail Fence</u>: This pattern is reminiscent of the fences that divided many of the fields in West Virginia... and still do!

<u>Churn Dash</u> The Churn Dash quilt pattern is a reminder that quilts are both beautiful and practical.

Even though the history of quilt trails are rooted in the surprisingly recent past, the blocks themselves tell stories from much longer ago.

The Trail in Pocahontas, West Virginia, is actually a great example. Crafted in 2013 when West Virginia was celebrating its 150th Birthday, the Pocahontas County Quilt Trail tells the story of the history of the region by using famous, historic quilt squares. You'll probably recognize most of them, but here are a few that the West Virginians included.




Quilt trails around the country have chosen their own blocks to tell the story of the people and places surrounding the trail. Using quilt squares to narrate history is almost like using a special code for an exclusive group of awesome crafters (like quilters!) It's pretty cool to consider yourself part of the inner circle.
