

# 2021 Hernando Quilt Guild Challenge

# Home Sweet Home

One of our favorite quilt blocks is the house pattern. Since the pieced block is technically simple, there is ample opportunity for experimentation. Our theme for 2021 is Home Sweet Home. Let your imagination run wild! Build your entry around the house of your dreams, the house of your childhood, a holiday house (don't get stuck on the standards – think about "Take your Pet to the Vet Day", Ground Hogs Day, Arbor Day, National Donut Day, etc.). How about your favorite house to visit, a haunted house or even your "today" house? Feel free to add activities, landscaping, pets, automobiles, hobbies, flora, fauna and/or other embellishments. You may use a purchased pattern, design one of your own, or use one of the blocks suggested by the committee. Don't limit yourself to a quilt or a wall hanging. Perhaps a pillow or a bag or a fabric basket.

As part of the challenge each participant must purchase a fat quarter of "Home Again Houses" fabric for \$5.00 as an entry fee (see Pam Russavage). This fabric must be visibly incorporated into the quilt top, although it's not necessary to use the entire fat quarter. To reclaim your entry fee, you must turn in your project for display and judging at the end of the challenge. Any entry fee not reclaimed will be donated to the guild to be used in one of its charities.



Categories: Entries will be judged in one category.

- Judging: The Guild Members will be judging for "Best of Show", 1<sup>st</sup> place, 2<sup>nd</sup> place, and 3<sup>rd</sup> place. Guild members will also vote for the winner of "Viewer's Choice".
- Composition: You must have the fabric "Home Again Houses" visibly included on the quilt top.
- Quilting: You must have hand or machine quilting on your entry.
- Size: No smaller than 16X16 and no larger than 45x60. If your entry is smaller or larger than the specifications, **your entry will not be judged**.
- Due Date: October 28, 2021 Guild Meeting
- Rules: You are not allowed to use a project that has been made previous to this challenge. It must be made between March 26, 2020 and October 28, 2021. There will be a sign-up sheet when you turn in your entry. You must label the back of your entry with your name and the entry title.

# THIS & THAT



### Dresden Plate Quilt Pattern and It's History

"The circular pattern commonly called the Dresden Plate would seem to be an easy pattern to date if it weren't for Anna Tuels' mother who made that 1785 quilt."

# The 20th Century Dresden Plate Quilt

The Dresden Plate quilt pattern was one of the most popular quilts made during the 1920s and 30s.


It was first published in the 20s but not always under the name Dresden Plate. Grandmother's Sunburst, Friendship Ring, Aster, Dahlia and Sunflower are all names I've seen for this pattern.

**The 1930s version** is usually easy to date because of the typical floral prints of the period. Some were made with pretty patterned feed-sacks while a few were done with solid prints.

A few Dresden Plate quilt blocks are made with a smooth outer circle as seen to the right.



More often the ends of the "petals" are rounded or pointed like the illustration below.



### The Dresden Connection With the Quilt Name

The popular name for this quilt, Dresden Plate, reflects the romance of the Victorian Era with its love of elaborate decoration on household items and décor. Dresden, Germany was a center of 19th century romanticism movement in art, one that included the fine decoration of porcelain. The plates were embellished with elaborate design using flowers, fruits and foliage. The beautiful plates would surely have been admired by women of the early 20th century.



### Earlier Designs Related to the Dresden Plate

Although this pattern was not well known until the late 1920s there were precursors to this pattern in the fan patterns of the late 1800s. You may have seen these fans in a Victorian crazy quilt. Some Dresden Plate blocks appear to be made of 4 fans sewn together. These wheels made of four fans were first seen in wool and later in cotton.




But there is indeed a much earlier example that used this configuration in the center of a wool, medallion style quilt. In fact this amazing antique is the earliest surviving American made pieced medallion quilt. It is inscribed, "ANNA TUELS HER BEDQUILT GIVEN TO HER BY HER MOTHER IN THE YEAR AUG 23. 1785". To the right is an illustration of the medallion center of Anna Tule's quilt on the right. The center Dresden Plate style motif is surrounded by hourglass and heart blocks and a wide beautifully quilted border.




If this early example was part of a trend any other quilts made with this design are gone. There is no other record of such a quilt until the latter part of the 19th century.
