GUILD NEWS AND NOTES



- 2022 Membership Dues The 2022 dues will be due in January 2022 and will be \$25.00 for all members renewing. The final deadline for dues is the February meeting. After that there will be a \$5.00 late fee.
- ❖ 2022 Charity Quilt Programs The Board has decided to restart our Charity Quilt program in January 2022. We will support two charities throughout the year. (1) The Airman's Attic at MacDill Air Force Base in Tampa and (2) The Child Advocacy Center in Hernando County. Quilts for the Child's Advocacy Center should be lap quilt size of 40" x 60". These are quilts for children when they are removed from their home due to abuse. Sandy Wesley will be the point person for Child's Advocacy. The Airman's Attic is looking for baby and small child items along with kitchen items that are in good condition. Gayle Keenan will be the point person for Airman's Attic
- * "Free For All" Table beginning in January 2022 we will have a "Free For All" table at each meeting. Any member who has good quality items that they no longer need and would like to pass on to another member may put it on the Free For All table. If it hasn't been taken by another member you will need to collect it and take it back home with you. Also, during the year if a member has an item that they wish to donate for the 2022 Christmas Party Chinese Auction please give it to Louise Isabelle.
- ❖ 2022 MYSTERY QUILT Please mark your calendars for January 11, 2022 and February 8, 2022 for the Mystery Quilt class at The Quarry Enrichment Center. Sandy Wesley has worked her magic and secured the Quarry upstairs and downstairs for these two classes. We are forgoing the March class as we have many classes to schedule (such a good thing!).
- ❖ 2022 LAKE YALE RETREAT Monday, February 28, March 1st, 2nd and 3rd 2022 The Retreat will again be held at Lake Yale in the McGuire Building and the cost will be \$275.00. Karen Pilon and your retreat committee have secured our date. We have collected your first deposit of \$100 which was due by the August meeting. Your second deposit of \$100 was due at the October meeting. Your final payment of \$75 is due no later than the January meeting. - ❖ 2022 GUILD CHALLENGE "TRIANGLES TRIANGLES TRIANGLES" is the theme for the 2022 challenge. Half square triangles, Quarter square triangles, Equilateral triangles [3 sides same length] Isosceles triangles [2 sides same length] All blocks in the quilt must be made from one or more of the above. The triangles can be composed of strips of fabric or from a single fabric. Strip sashing between blocks is allowed, if your design requires it. No squares, rectangles, circles, hexagons, or any other shape − unless they are created with triangles. Optical illusions allowed − as long as they are created with triangles. The challenge due date is November meeting 2022. See Kathleen East if you have any questions. See page 6 for further information.
- ❖ 2023 QUILT SHOW— The Quilt Show has been changed to 2023 since we feel it would be difficult to start getting our committee heads together and having meetings for the show. Kathleen East as the winner of the 2021 Challenge has chosen "Triangles" as the theme for the 2022 Challenge. Below are the instructions.



HQG Quilt Challenge 2022

Is



TRIANGLES!! TRIANGLES!! TRIANGLES!!



Half square triangles
Quarter square triangles
Equilateral triangles [3 sides same length]
Isosceles triangles [2 sides same length]



ALL blocks in the quilt must be made from one or more of the above. The triangles can be composed of strips of fabric or from a single fabric. Strip sashing between blocks is allowed, if your design requires it. No squares, rectangles, circles, hexagons, or any other shape — unless they are created with triangles. Optical illusions allowed — as long as they are created with triangles.

Categories: Entries will be judged in one category

Judging:

An outside judge will choose

- Best of Show
- 1st Place
- 2nd Place
- 3rd Place

Guild members will vote for the winner of "Viewer's Choice"

Quilting:

Your quilt must be hand or machine quilted

Size:

No smaller than 16"x 16" and no larger than 45"x60". If your entry is

larger or smaller than the specifications, your entry will not be judged.

Due Date:

November 17, 2022 at the Guild Meeting

Rules:

The quilt for this entry must have been made during this challenge year, between November 16, 2021 and November 17, 2022. Your quilt must have a label on the back with your name and the quilt entry title.



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



