As I write this article, I am getting ready to make my return to Florida. Less than two weeks and anxious for my return and all the events that our guild will be offering.



- **2019 September Yard Sale** We had a yard sale of all leftover fabric, books, notions, etc., plus items that were donated to the guild upon the death of Viola Imhof, from her family. We made about \$740.00 which was earmarked to help with additional Quilt Show printing expenses. Thank you members for your support.
- ❖ 2019 November 1 & 2 Quilt Show

 The Flyer and Quilt Show Info including map to the Quarry have been posted to our website as well as a picture of our Opportunity Quilt. Barb has sent an e-mail out to other Guilds in the area and attached our flyer and info page for them to share with their groups. We are also listed on the calendar page of the Florida Quilt Network. We have purchased an 8 x 10 full page ad on the inside back cover of the Program that was handed out at Stitcher Paradise , July 18 − 20, 2019 at the Hilton Carillon , St. Petersburg. In September our ad appeared in the Country Register. Flyers and an info page have been distributed to most of the quilt shops in the area. Barb will distribute our flyer to some Restaurants and maybe store fronts that will accept it also. Ads have been placed in various Newspapers and we will have an announcement on our local Radio WWJD the week before the show. Barb has finished the Quilt Show Program and it is in the hands of our printer for 500 copies.
- 2019 QUILT SHOW OPPORTUNITY QUILT (Rosewood Cottage "Revisited")

The Opportunity Quilt is finished, quilted, bound and labeled. It appears on our website and we have been selling tickets at some of the other Guild monthly meetings such as Nature Coast, West Pasco and Feather Princess, so far. We sold tickets at Nana's Quilt shop on August 2nd during their annual sale. Tickets were sold on September 7th at Scrap & Sew in Lutz during their demo days and September 14th at Happy Apple in Tampa. They also advertised our opportunity quilt at their shop news along with a picture I had sent them. Several of our members have already purchased their suggested \$10.00 worth of tickets and continue to do so. We are asking each member to be responsible for 12 tickets (6 for \$5.00) total of \$10.00 each member, and pay for them in advance when you sign up for your ticket packet. Tickets will be sold on Friday, October 25th at the Brookridge Friday Night Bingo which should reach a lot of people. Tickets will be available for sale next to the admissions table throughout the Quilt Show as well. The drawing will take place about 2:00pm on November 2nd, which is the last day of the show.

❖ 2019 CHRISTMAS LUNCHEON – December 5th – Our Christmas Luncheon will be at R Beach this year on December 5th. It will be buffet style with 3 choices at a cost of \$30.00 per person. We will be doing a \$20.00 gift exchange. If you bring a wrapped gift, you will receive a wrapped gift. 
2020 Hernando Guild Challenge

The Roaring 20's

The 2019 Guild Challenge winners of "Best of Show" and "Viewer's Choice", Pam Russavage and Terry Coley, have chosen "The Roaring 20's" as the theme for the 2020 Challenge in honor of moving into the next decade of the 21st Century.

The 1920's were nicknamed "The Roaring 20's" due to the exuberance, drama and boisterousness of the decade. You could incorporate these elements into your quilt with color, fabric and embellishments. Historically, the 1920's are known for women's suffrage, Hollywood's golden era, popularization of the automobile, prohibition and speakeasies, jazz, the new woman (flappers), Frank Lloyd Wright, Art Deco, Modern Abstract art and the stock market crash, to name a few. You may want to base your quilt on one of these subjects. You may want to play off the theme title; using animal prints or 20 different fabrics, or even 20-20 vision. You can use a purchased quilt pattern, or design one of your own, create a mini quilt, wall hanging or pillow.

Let your imagination roar in celebration of a new decade



Categories: Entries will be judged in one category.

Judging: We will again try to bring in an outside judge and will have "Best of Show", 1st place, 2nd place,

and 3rd place. Guild members will vote for the winner of "Viewer's Choice".

Quilting: You must have hand or machine quilting on your entry.

Size: No smaller than 16X16 and no larger than 45x60. If your entry is smaller or larger than the

specifications, your entry will not be judged.

Due Date: February 27, 2020 – Guild Meeting

Rules: You are not allowed to use a project that has been made previous to this challenge. It must be

made between March 28, 2019 and February 27, 2020. There will be a sign-up sheet when you

turn in your entry and you must have your name on the back of the entry.



THIS & THAT



5 Simple Ways To Organize Fabric

Do you suffer from SABLE syndrome (Stash Accumulation Beyond Life Expectancy)? If you do, you've come to the right place! To us, SABLE seems not so much a syndrome—it's more of a sign. A GOOD sign that you're a dedicated quilter who always has piles of muses at the ready. After all, when it comes to fabric, the more the merrier! Even if you're new to stash building, it helps to keep your fabrics corralled so you can easily find what you want, when you want. So today we're sharing a few easy-to-implement ideas for organizing fabric—because when you've got a system to help you keep track of all your treasures, you'll be ready to sew whenever inspiration strikes!

Fold, fold, fold. When you fold your fabrics to a uniform size, they're easier to stack (and prettier to look at). Follow these steps: • Use a 6"- or 8"-wide acrylic rotary-cutting ruler to wrap fabric around until the piece is fully folded around the ruler.





Slide the ruler out of the fabric until the folded piece measures to the uniform size you want (in this example, the fabric is folded to form a 5" rectangle). Fold the fabric onto itself with the ruler still in place. The ruler's edge will create a crisp fold. Remove the ruler and fold the fabric onto itself, keeping the size of the fabric folds at 5" (or whatever size you desire).

Stack folded fabrics on a shelf, or stack them vertically in a basket or bin with the fold in the fabric facing front. And speaking of bins and baskets.

. Bins, baskets, and boxes, oh my! Containers of all sorts come in handy when organizing your stash, especially if you don't have much room to spare. Matching containers are nice, but if the cost of buying several at a time is holding you back, take a look around the house—any container will do. From there you can organize fabric by color, size, style, or type of precut. Think about how you select fabrics for a quilt to determine which categories will work best for you. Whether you stack your containers in a closet, slide them under the bed, or place them on shelves in your sewing room, seeing your stash at a glance makes it easy to start a new project.

A "shoe"-in for fat quarters.

Amassed a LOT of single fatquarter cuts over time? Kim

Diehl's clever idea for storing
them is perfect—use an over-thedoor shoe holder! Rolling or
folding fat quarters uniformly will
give your stash a tidy look.



Because scraps tend to be small and oddly shaped, they can get lost in a shuffle of yardage or precuts. But sort them by color and put them in see-through glass jars?

They become so pretty, you'll

want to put them on display.



5. Why organize when you can decorate? No need to hide away every fabric in a bin or basket—instead, turn your favorite cuts into a display you'll love to show off. We adore what "Sunday Best Quilts" coauthor Sherri McConnell calls her "library stack" approach:







Recipe Corner

Short Rib Cobbler

Ingredients

1/2 cup plus 3 tablespoons all-purpose flour, divided 1-1/4 teaspoons salt, divided

1/2 teaspoon pepper

2 pounds well-trimmed boneless beef short ribs, cut

into 1-1/2-in. pieces

5 tablespoons olive oil, divided

1 large onion, chopped

1 medium carrot, chopped

1 celery rib, chopped

1 garlic clove, minced

2 tablespoons tomato paste

5 cups beef stock

1 cup dry red wine or additional beef stock

1 teaspoon poultry seasoning

1 bay leaf

1 package (14 ounces) frozen pearl onions, thawed

4 medium carrots, cut into 2-inch pieces

COBBLER TOPPING:

2 cups biscuit/baking mix 2/3 cup 2% milk Fresh thyme leaves

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°. In a shallow bowl, mix 1/2 cup flour, 3/4 teaspoon salt and pepper. Dip short ribs in flour mixture to coat all sides; shake off excess.
- 2. In an ovenproof Dutch oven, heat 3 tablespoons oil over medium heat. Brown beef in batches. Remove from pan.
- 3. In same pan, heat remaining oil over medium heat. Add onion, chopped carrot and celery; cook and stir 2-3 minutes or until tender. Add garlic; cook 1 minute longer. Stir in tomato paste and remaining flour until blended. Gradually stir in stock and wine until smooth. Return beef to pan; stir in poultry seasoning, bay leaf and remaining salt. Bring to a boil.
- 4. Bake, covered, 1-3/4 hours. Stir in pearl onions and carrot pieces. Bake, covered, 30-45 minutes longer or until beef and onions are tender. Skim fat and remove bay leaf.
- 5. In a small bowl, mix biscuit mix and milk just until a soft dough forms. Drop by scant 1/4 cupfuls over beef mixture. Bake, uncovered, 40-45 minutes longer or until topping is golden brown. Sprinkle with thyme.

Louise Isabelle displaying her "Square On Point" Quilt. This is a very popular pattern and has been taught a few times, but look at the back – wow! Nice Louise.

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
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


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
