

# Guild Challenge - 2021

# 2021 Hernando Quilt Guild Challenge

## Home Sweet Home

One of our favorite quilt blocks is the house pattern. Since the pieced block is technically simple, there is ample opportunity for experimentation. Our theme for 2021 is Home Sweet Home. Let your imagination run wild! Build your entry around the house of your dreams, the house of your childhood, a holiday house (don't get stuck on the standards – think about "Take your Pet to the Vet Day", Ground Hogs Day, Arbor Day, National Donut Day, etc.). How about your favorite house to visit, a haunted house or even your "today" house? Feel free to add activities, landscaping, pets, automobiles, hobbies, flora, fauna and/or other embellishments. You may use a purchased pattern, design one of your own, or use one of the blocks suggested by the committee. Don't limit yourself to a quilt or a wall hanging. Perhaps a pillow or a bag or a fabric basket.

As part of the challenge each participant must purchase a fat quarter of "Home Again Houses" fabric for \$5.00 as an entry fee (see Pam Russavage). This fabric must be visibly incorporated into the quilt top, although it's not necessary to use the entire fat quarter. To reclaim your entry fee, you must turn in your project for display and judging at the end of the challenge. Any entry fee not reclaimed will be donated to the guild to be used in one of its charities.



Categories: Entries will be judged in one category.

Judging: The Guild Members will be judging for "Best of Show", 1st place, 2nd place, and 3rd place. Guild

members will also vote for the winner of "Viewer's Choice".

Composition: You must have the fabric "Home Again Houses" visibly included on the quilt top.

Quilting: You must have hand or machine quilting on your entry.

Size: No smaller than 16X16 and no larger than 45x60. If your entry is smaller or larger than the

specifications, your entry will not be judged.

Due Date: October 28, 2021 – Guild Meeting

Rules: You are not allowed to use a project that has been made previous to this challenge. It must be

made between March 26, 2020 and October 28, 2021. There will be a sign-up sheet when you turn in your entry. You must label the back of your entry with your name and the entry title.

# Stash Management

Almost all quilters have a fabric stash; some are quite substantial! I've heard quilters cheekily say they don't own stashes, they "curate fabric collections." Just for fun, I looked up the definition of the word "stash," and according to Webster, a stash is "a supply of something, typically one that is kept hidden or secret." Yep, that about sums it up. (Webster's wife must have been a quilter!)

In this era of making purposeful purchases, many quilters feel the need to actually use the fabrics they already own. I've seen quilters on social media post about their de-stashing attempts. They may share how many yards of fabric they began the year with and then list the number of yards they use for each quilt they make. Some downsize and host a fabric stash sale (been there, done that), and others are simply bewildered at the thought of trying to use all the fabric they've owned for years. It can be very overwhelming. Where do you begin?

Let's start with fat quarters. I don't think there is a quilter alive who doesn't own one or more of them. Fat quarters have been around for decades because of their fabulously usable size. They measure about 18" x 20"—enough fabric to do lots of things with, yet small enough to be affordable. They are like quilters' candy bars. Even when you go to your local quilt shop to peruse the aisles and nothing on the bolts jumps out to say "take me home," chances are you'll pick up a fat quarter or two at the register because it doesn't seem right to leave empty handed.



Some quilters buy fat quarter bundles and save them for "someday," but they never get around to untying the bow because they simply don't know how to use them to their best advantage. If you're one of those folks, I've got some great ideas for tackling those cutie-patootie fabric bundles by cutting them into usable sizes you'll reach for to incorporate into your next quilt! Here are a couple of ways I like to cut my fat quarters:



#### In Figure 2, I cut each fat quarter into the following sizes:

- 2 3" strips
- 1 41/2" strip
- 1 11/2" x 121/2" strip
- 2 6" x 6" squares
- 1 7½" x 7½" square

These sizes work well for more traditional construction methods (the 3" strips can easily be turned into 2%" x 2%" squares for half-square triangles, and so on) and give you more options for appliqué shapes and larger pieced units.

Of course, you can certainly adjust these sizes to fit your specific quilting needs. Ultimately, you want them to be usable sizes within easy reach so you won't put off sewing them into your blocks and quilts.



#### In Figure 1, I cut each fat quarter into the following sizes:

- 2 21/2" strips
- 2 1½" strips
- □ 1 10" x 10" square
- 2 5" x 5" squares
- 2 5" x 2½" rectangles
- 4 2½\* x 2½\* squares

These sizes are some of the most commonly used sizes in quiltmaking. They will unlock a plethora of block options, as you can construct blocks and patterns written especially for precuts like strip rolls, 10° squares, and 5" squares. If you tend to make these types of quilts, this method gives you the most bang for your fat-quarter buck.



# THIS & THAT (Continued)



#### Here are some other things to consider:

Forget the eighths. When cutting fat quarters, focus on cutting quarter-, half-, and whole-inch increments so you don't spend too much time cutting anything with a one-eighth-inch size. When you want smaller units, you can trim to eighth-inch increments for traditional construction methods.

Sort and store. Use clear plastic storage boxes, clean pizza boxes, or empty shoe boxes to store each individual size. For instance, start a pile of 2½" strips in one box, 10" squares in another box, and so on. Label everything plainly by the size of the units so you can reach for them at a glance.

#### A few minutes here and there...

Every time you go into your studio, set aside 20–30 minutes to cut a few fat quarters and sort the units. Don't feel pressured to do it all at once. It will get done eventually.

#### Organize colors and styles.

It helps to keep the colors or types of fabrics grouped together to make it easier to find a certain size for your quilts. Store your batiks in one pile, your reproduction fabrics in another pile, and so on. Or, if you are a scrappy quilter, store like colors together.

#### Tackle small yardage amounts.

Once you've cut all your fat quarters, look through your stash for other small amounts of fabric or unusually shaped pieces of yardage. If you have a third of a yard or less, you're more likely to use the fabric if you cut it up into strips, squares, or rectangles.

Stash management may seem like a Herculean task, but with a little cutting and persistence, you'll have many usable sizes of fabric to reach for when constructing your quilts! So, get your rotary cutter out and start cutting!



#### Cake Layer

- 1 Large can pumpkin pie mix
- 2 Eggs
- 2/3 cup milk

#### **Christmas Eve Cornish Game Hens**

#### Ingredients

- 4 Cornish game hens
- 2 cups brown sugar
- 2 cups orange juice
- 4 Tbsp. margarine or butter
- 1/2 tsp. allspice
- 2 tsp. dry mustard

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







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
