- ❖ **NO FORMAL MEETINGS IN JULY & AUGUST**

At our March Guild meeting Bonnie informed members that due to the lack of a quorum of our Board members during July and August we will not have Board meetings, or Guild meetings during July and August this year. **We are, however opening up the Spring Lake House on the Guild meeting dates for July and August with an OPEN SEW. - ❖ **2017 GUILD CHALLENGE - "COLOR"**— As the winner of Best of Show of the 2016 Guild Challenge, Shirley Kerstetter has chosen the subject for the February, 2017 Challenge. The subject is "**Color**" The idea is to choose complementary colors from the color wheel (any two colors directly opposite each other on the color wheel. Example: (Blue and Orange). You may use shades of the colors of your choice. Solid, Moda type or tone on tone small print. The possibilities are endless with such a broad category. Get your creative juices flowing. We would like to have a large participation. The directions and subject will be available at the April meeting and e-mailed before summer, so the snowbirds could start working on it while home for the summer. Just remember the rules. The quilt has to be made between February 25th, 2016 to February, 23rd, 2017. Size should be no smaller than 16x16 and no larger than 45x60. You must put your name on the back of the quilt, or it will not be judged. The quilts will be judged at the February 23rd, 2017 Guild Meeting.
- ❖ **2017 LAKEWOOD RETREAT – MARCH 6 – 9, 2017**— Our annual Quilt Retreat for 2017 will again be at Lakewood Retreat Center, 25458 Dan Brown Hill Rd., Brooksville, FL, March 6th to 9th. Remember the retreat covers a room with two single beds and one double bed, with a private bathroom. As far as we know now we will have the place to ourselves, so we will be using two buildings. Meals will be served Buffet style and we will have two sewing rooms, one very large room and one smaller room. 



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Quilter's Corner

A Talented Quilter and Guild Secretary

Beverly Abenante



Beverly was born in Queens, New York, the second of four children, to Estelle and William Seward. They moved to Seaford, Long Island when she was five. Her dad was a NY City fireman, and had a second job painting houses. Her mom was a graduate of Pratt and majored in home economics and cooking; she was a stay-at-home mother until Bev's brother turned 5. She then returned to her profession. Bev started embroidery at 8 years old while recovering from Polio. Later they all had to sew their summer clothes as finances were tight. She took business classes in high school and home economics. It was then she made her first Poodle skirt. After high school, she enrolled in adult education and took intermediate dress making and advanced sewing with a teacher from Singer. She made suits, a plaid wool dress and a winter coat. By that time sewing was in her blood!

She married at 18 years old and had three children just before she turned 21. Her mother and mother-in-law gave her scraps of material to make the kids clothes. She made Easter outfits and spring coats. When the children were 3, 5 and 6, Bev went back to work part time, learned how to drive and got a car.

Years later while visiting Kutztown, Pennsylvania she walked into a barn filled with beautiful quilts. This sparked her interest in quilting, so she bought her first small quilt book. Since there were no guilds in Long Island at the time, she found a crocheted quilt pattern in Women's Day Magazine and crocheted the blocks on the train commuting each day to work. Next she found a preprinted kids pattern and decided to trapunto the bears and clothes and make a quilt for her granddaughter. It was a hit and she loved it to death.

As time went on her husband got a retirement package that they couldn't resist, so they put the house on the market and moved to Spring Hill, FL. Also, her parents were living in Largo and needed their help. A few of her friends knew of her desire to learn how to quilt, so together they joined a class with Helga Curtis in Hernando County making a sampler quilt, which she finally quilted 5 years later on her domestic machine. She then joined West Pasco Quilters Guild and was a member for ten years.

Bev wanted to improve on her applique skills so she joined Feather Princesses about three months from their start date. She has been an active member for the last ten years printing membership cards and taking photos of the meetings as well as sharing the photos on the internet to all the members. One of the National teachers was Sharon Phillips Swallon from Pennsylvania, who taught embroidery. Bev took the class, which inspired her to revisit her hand embroidery and improve upon it. She now uses embroidery to compliment her applique making baby quilts and large quilts. She also does machine and hand piecing to round out her talents.

Bev has been a member of Hernando Quilters Guild for a few years now and is presently the Guild Secretary. Bev participated in the making of our last Opportunity Quilt by stitching one of the very long applique borders. She really loves hand work of any kind and does wool applique and some Swedish Weaving as well. She took a class in ribbon embroidery, using this technique when making the Crab Apple Hill Angels pattern. She says she has learned to enjoy the journey and loves a challenge. With every project she learns something new and looks forward to the next.

HERNANDO QUILTERS GUILD 25 Years And Still Going Strong






May 20, 2016 A Trip To Suwannee Valley Quilt Shop

You can only use two colors and also shades of the colors of your choice. Solid, Moda type or tone on tone small print. The possibilities are endless with such a broad category. Get your creative juices flowing. We would like to have a large participation. If you have any questions, see or call Shirley Kerstetter at (352) 686-9057.

Categories: Applique* (hand and machine in the same category*), Pieced (machine and paper in the same category*), Embroidered (hand and machine in the same category*), Mixed Technique and Wearable Art.

Judging: Viewer’s Choice in all categories for 1st, 2nd and 3rd and “Best of Show.”

Quilting: You must have hand or machine quilting on your quilt.

Size: No smaller than 16x16” and no larger than 45x60”. If you are smaller, or larger than the specifications, **your quilt will not be judged.**

Due Date: February 23, 2017 – Guild Meeting

Rules: You are not allowed to use a quilt that has been made previous to this challenge. It must be made between February 25th, 2016 and February 23rd, 2017. There will be a sign-up sheet when you bring in your quilt to put your name on and which category your quilt is in. **ALSO**, you must have your name on the back of your quilt. No name, no judging.

* There must be 4 quilts in each category to be judged separately (example 4 hand appliqued and 4 machine appliqued). Otherwise, all appliqued quilts will be judged as one category.



Tips / Tricks/This & That

TIPS FROM QUILTERS AROUND THE COUNTRY

Creative Ideas For Creative Quiltmaking

I was asked where I come up with ideas for quilts. Here are a few thoughts, which I am still working on...

- I "sit" with my fabric, and let it talk to me. IT knows how it wants to spend the rest of its life. I just have to quietly listen. Sometimes a piece of fabric will "speak" to me in the store, with a "picture-in-my-mind" of itself as a finished quilt or quilt block.
- Pick a "NON-QUILTING" MAGAZINE, like a tractor catalog, a recipe magazine, or a gardening magazine (it doesn't matter!). Tell yourself that the original idea MUST come from something you see in the magazine. NOT the WHOLE concept, necessarily, just that initial "push". Maybe it will be an advertisement in the magazine. (Scan the picture, and include it in your quilt or signature label if you want.)
- Pick a NON-QUILTING BOOK - a biography, a fiction, a history, a "how-to", or a horse-training manual (it doesn't matter!). Read the TITLES of the chapters, and let that spark your imagination. (In other words, you might "name" your quilt before you make it. You can change the name, later, if you wish.)
- Pick a SEASON. (Draw from a hat, if you can't choose.) Express that season as a quilt.
- Pick a SEASON, and REFUSE to use colors that are "traditional" for that season. (DO NOT use gold or brown for FALL.)
- Interpret a SEASON and DO NOT use leaves, trees, flowers or block names that are "seasonal" in nature.
- Pull 3 (or 4, or 5) color names from a hat, and use ONLY those colors in a quilt.
- Pull 3 (or 4, or 5) color names from a hat and DO NOT use those colors in a quilt.
- Think of an ACTIVITY. Interpret, and quilt that. (Picking blueberries. Singing a song. Riding a bicycle. Missing the bus. Putting on pantyhose. Ice-skating.)
- Pick your favorite animal, and incorporate it into a quilt.
- Make a quilt based on the TITLE of a song.
- Find a favorite QUOTE (famous or otherwise). Express that WHOLE quote as a quilt.
- Pick a period in history. 1500's – 1800's, 1920's, 1930, or 1940's. Express the "feel" of the era.



Creative Ideas For Creative Quiltmaking - Continued

- Ask a child or other person what their favorite THING is. Whatever they say... use that in a quilt. You may "interpret" the item "generally" or "specifically", at your discretion. (If they say "Barbie", it can be "doll", or "fashion doll", or "BARBIE"..., or "dolls of the world", or "dolls from history"..., or "Oh, you beautiful doll", or "Hello, Dolly", or "I dropped my dolly in the dirt", or "all dolled up", etc.)
