

## THIS & THAT....

## Superior Threads Thread-ology by Bob Purcell

Superior Threads recommends using top stitch machine needles of various sizes (70, 80,90,100) for quilting, piecing, and applique sewing. Both the eye of the needle and the thread groove of a top stitch needle are extra-large, so you should never have thread breakage due to thread fraying against a too small groove.

Titanium Top Stitch needles made by organ last three times longer because of the titanium coating. Superior Threads asked Organ Needles to make them and Superior Threads sells them.

If your machine suddenly makes a noise while stitching, this is a sure sign to change your needle for a new one.

When sewing with metallic thread, the top tension on your machine should be 2 to 3.5 (best tension on most machines). The top stitch needle for metallic thread is size 80.

The size of the top stitch needs (70, 80,90,100) represents the width of the shaft for various thread sizes.





### Menopause – Food for thought!!!



### Monthly Quilt Show Boutique Project

Louise Isabelle has asked that instead of waiting until September, 2019 to finish your fat quarter cutting, could you please work ahead and do 3 or 4 at a time. If we wait until September, 2019 to complete, we will not have enough time to make up the final packets for the Boutique.

Trim your Fat Quarters carefully. Remove the selvedge. Then cut each Fat Quarter as described below.

- The first cut will be 10" this will then be cut into two 10" squares
- Next cut a 5" strip. Then sub-cut into four 5" squares
- ☐ Finally, cut a 2 ½" strip



Pass your Charms, Layer Cakes and 2 ½" strips to either Louise Isabelle, or Terri Coley at the Guild Meeting. Put them in a plastic bag each month and put your name on the bag.

Cut two Fat Quarters of each color (See Sample above)

Two 10" Squares Four 5" Charms

One 2 1/2" Strip
