


# 2019 Hernando Guild Challenge – "CARD TRICK"

As the winner of "Best of Show" for the 2018 Guild Challenge, Sue House with the help of Shirley Kerstetter – Viewer's Choice, has chosen the subject for the 2019 Challenge. The Subject is the "Card Trick" Quilt Block.

The Card Trick Quilt Block must be featured in your quilt and be easily recognizable. The block can be any size and color. You can incorporate one or multiple blocks in your design, create a traditional or mini quilt, or create a unique design of your own. Applique and/or embellishments may be included. A sample of the Card Trick block and a breakdown view is

pictured below.







(There is a pattern available for a 12" Card Trick block on (<u>www.quilterscache.com</u>) I'm sure you can find a pattern on the internet in a smaller block size as well.

**Categories:** The Quilts will be judged in one category.

**Judging:** We will again try to bring in an outside judge and will have "Best of Show", 1st

place, 2<sup>nd</sup> place and 3<sup>rd</sup> place. Guild members will vote for the winner of

"Viewer's Choice."

**Quilting:** You must have hand or machine quilting on your quilt.

Size: No smaller than 16x16" and no larger than 45x60". If you are smaller, or larger

than the specifications, your quilt will not be judged.

**Due Date:** February 28, 2019 – Guild Meeting

**Rules:** You are not allowed to use a quilt that has been made previous to this

challenge. It must be made between March 22, 2018 and February 28, 2019. There will be a sign-up sheet when you turn in your quilt. ALSO, you must

have your name on the back of your quilt.




# **Monthly Quilt Show Boutique Project**

Louise Isabelle has come up with a project that we will all be involved in for the Quilt Show Boutique. We will be making our own Charm Packs, Layer Cakes and 2 ½" strips from Fat Quarters. Each month will have an assigned color. You will cut 2 Fat Quarters a month, in the following way:

Trim your Fat Quarters carefully. Remove the selvedge. Then cut each Fat Quarter as described below.

- ☐ The first cut will be 10" this will then be cut into two 10" squares
- Next cut a 5" strip. Then sub-cut into four 5" squares
- ☐ Finally, cut a 2 ½" strip



Pass your Charms, Layer Cakes and 2 ½" strips to either Louise Isabelle, or Terri Coley at the Guild Meeting. Put them in a plastic bag each month and put your name on the bag.

Cut two Fat Quarters a month into: (See Sample above)

Two 10" Squares Four 5" Charms One 2 1/2" Strip

# **Pieced Borders**

Carrie Nelson - Miss Rosie's Quilts

A pieced border is like a picture frame: it adds structure, balance, and beauty to the main attraction. When you start to think of borders as a design element like Carrie does—just as important as the center of a quilt—you can take your quilts to a new level of "wow!"

But how do you make a pretty pieced border that fits your quilt top? No worries: Carrie's got you covered, and her smart tip below works for all kinds of pieced borders. Best of all? It's an easy fix. Just a little extra stitching here and there and your pieced border will shrink or grow to the perfect size. Read on for Carrie's sage advice.

When it comes to pieced borders, sometimes you get it right the first time. Most of the time, we need to adjust. In this case, it means adjusting the length of the pieced border. The easiest and least noticeable way to make the border strip the same length as the quilt top is to make some of the seams just a skosh bigger or smaller.

If you need to shorten the border strip, sew a line of stitching just inside the first seamline. If you need a longer border strip, sew a line of stitching just outside the first seamline and then remove the first line of stitching. That 1/16" difference in seam will add up to 1/8" between the two units. An eighth of an inch removed eight times quickly adds up to an inch. Just make sure that you randomly space the larger or smaller seams so that they aren't obvious, and you're good to go.

## **Recipe Corner**

With Christmas around the corner I thought I would give you a few holiday recipes to try from the Quilter's Christmas Cookbook. One Entrée and one Dessert.

# **Christmas Eve Cornish Game Hens**

### Ingredients

- 4 Cornish game hens
- 2 cups brown sugar
- 2 cups orange juice
- 4 Tbsp. margarine or butter
- ½ tsp. allspice
- 2 tsp. dry mustard

#### **Directions**

- Coat medium roasting pan with non-stick cooking spray.
   Place hens in roasting pan.
- 2. In saucepan mix together brown sugar, orange juice, margarine, allspice and mustard. Heat to boiling. Pour sauce over hens.
- 3. Bake at 375 degrees for 1 ¼ hours, basting occasionally.
- 4. Serve with wild rice and a vegetable medley.

# **Pecan Delights**

#### Makes 6-8 dozen

## Ingredients

- 1 cup butter
- ½ cup sugar
- 1 Tbsp. water
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- 2 cups flour
- 2 cups chopped pecans
- Sugar to coat

## Directions

- 1. Cream together butter and ½ cup sugar until light and fluffy. Blend in water and vanilla. Stir in flour and pecans and mix well.
- Flour hands, break off pieces of dough, and shape like dates. Place one inch apart on ungreased cookie sheet.
- 3. Bake at 325 degrees for 25-30 minutes until very light brown. While still warm, roll cookies in sugar and place on rack to cool.




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
