

Tips / Tricks

REMOVING PENCIL LINES FROM FABRIC

Here's a great recipe to remove pencil lines from your quilt top:


1/4 cup water 3/4 cup rubbing alcohol 7-8 drops of Palmolive liquid detergent


Mix and apply with a toothbrush No other liquid detergent will work as well - you truly DO need to use Palmolive.

ATTACHING BINDING TIP

For anyone who uses a large Plexiglas bed on your sewing machine when you are quilting, or attaching binding, this tip is cool! The picture tells the story. I used this tip just last week and it really works very well. First time I did not have my binding on the floor and pulling it's weight on the machine bed.

You don't have to worry about finding perfectly matching fabrics; if you have nine reds (or any other color), the tenth will blend with the others.

If you decide to make a larger quilt, you just need to acquire more scraps and make additional blocks.

Scrap quilts can be made from your stash. Everyone knows that stash quilts are free.

You can buy any fabric you want and know that it can go in a scrap quilt.

RECIPES

FRESH APPLE CAKE

Serving: One Sheet Cake

<u>Ingredients</u>

- 11/2 cups oil
- 2 cups white sugar
- 3 eggs, well beaten
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- 3 cups all purpose flour
- 1 tsp. soda
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. cinnamon
- 1 cup pecans, finely chopped
- 3 cups fresh apples, peeled and chopped

Mix oil, sugar, eggs, and vanilla

Add rest of dry ingredients. Stir well.

Add fresh apples and pecans. Mixture will be very thick.

Pour into greased and floured 11 x 13 pan.

Bake at 350 for 45 minutes to an hour. Cool then frost.

Frosting:

6oz. cream cheese

- 2 T. butter
- 2 tsp. vanilla
- 4 cups confectionery sugar
- 1 cup pecans, MIX WELL

This cake is VERY moist and gets better after the first day, so it's good to make ahead of time.

ADAPTABLE MEAL - Casserole

The nice thing about this is the adaptability – you can use chicken breast, chicken thighs, pork chops, all-meat pork ribs or all-meat beef ribs. Changing to one of the flavored dried onion soups adds variety, too. The recipe is adaptable and the results are great. Fix a salad with this and the meal is complete.

Butter

- 1 ½ cups of Uncle Ben's rice
- 1 package Lipton's Dried Onion Soup
- 1 can Campbell's Cream of Chicken and Mushroom soup
- 1 1/2 cups water

About a pound of your choice of meat: chicken breast or thighs, pork chops, all-meat pork ribs, all-meat beef ribs.

Preheat oven to 350 (or set for delayed baking.) Grease your casserole dish with a thin layer of butter. Spread the rice evenly on the bottom of the dish. Mix the soups and water together. Place the meat on top of the rice, then pour the soup mixture over – making certain that all of the meat is covered. Uncovered meat will dry out. Cover the casserole and place in the oven for 1 ½ hours.

Murphy's Laws for Quilters

- On any given day the number of employees in a quilt shop is inversely proportional to the number of customers needing quick attention.
- In cutting an intricate multi-piece block, your ruler will slip on the last side of the last patch.
- 3. When there is no time to do something right, there will always be time to do it over.
- 4. The value of any piece of fabric is directly proportional to the speed and ease with which you will ruin it.
- In any mail-order shipment the item you need the most will be back-ordered.
- 6. Accidental destruction of a fabric will only occur to an expensive imported cotton, never to muslin bought at 50% off.
- 7. Fabric dyes will never run until the quilt has been completed.
- A block with flawlessly straight sides, precision corners and perfect color placement will always be the wrong size.
- When you finally have your sewing space in the empty bedroom exactly the way you want it your son, or daughter will move back home.
- You will find the perfect fabric for your quilt only after it has been discontinued by the manufacturer.
- 11. The busier you are on any given day the greater the number of quilting inspirations you will want to try.
- 12. If a novice quilter decides to watch you use your rotary cutter, you will always ruin the fabric and cut yourself.
- 13. The top will always be completed and basted to the backing before you notice the one block that has a mistake in it.
- 14. The quilt-marking pencil that you tested on every fabric before you marked your quilt top won't disappear after you have completed the quilt.
- 15. You finally get a great idea for your Guild's challenge one week before the quilts are due.
- 16. No matter how much fabric you have bought, you are not going to have enough for the quilt you want to make.

GUILD CHALLENGE RULES Revisited

In order to have a clear vision of what is expected for the challenge, here are the two STEADFAST RULES that should apply every year. The person who is choosing the challenge must put these two rules in their instructions.

- All challenge quilts must be made specifically for the challenge and made only within the challenge year.
- 2) All quilts must be no smaller than 16" x 16" and no larger than 40" x 60" (Crib Size).

All other instructions are up to the person running the challenge for that particular year.

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
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
