Who's Who In The Guild







Bonnie Giustozzi

Bonnie was born in Brooklyn, New York where she spent her first 13 years. Her parents bought their first home in New Hyde Park, Long Island and they all moved on to a better place. She was one of 4 girls and 2 boys and had a relatively happy childhood even though she had rheumatic fever 3 times before graduating High School.

She married her first husband in 1962 and moved to Massachusetts where her son and two daughters were born. She loved New England, but missed her family a great deal. Work was not plentiful for carpenters in the winter in New England, so they decided to follow her parents south to Florida in 1973. she has been here ever since. She met her second husband in 1981 after her first marriage crumbled.

She worked in Home Health Care and really loved the work and the patients – it was a wonderful career. Unfortunately, the rheumatic fever did some damage to her heart resulting in openheart surgery in 1994 and she could no longer perform the physical aspect of her job.

She has sewn all her life (self-taught, but her grandma used to make all of their Easter outfits). Bonnie attempted her first Quilt in 1992 starting with a Log Cabin and she says she could not believe the feeling of accomplishment it gave her. After that, the quilting bug took hold and became her passion once she had stopped working. She joined the Guild in 1998 and says she met some of the best friends she's ever had in her life.

She was President from 2001 to 2003 and has been membership chairman for the past 5 years. She says her friends in the Guild were her strength when she lost her husband, Orlando, in 2007 after 25 years together. He was her most complimentary critic and loved to show off her work to just about anyone he could.

She keeps busy most days sewing and enjoying her youngest grandson, who is 15 months old. She has 3 grandsons, 1 granddaughter and 1 great-grandson.

Bonnie says, "my oldest daughter tells me I don't have to sew so much as it's not 'my job', but it makes me happy and I must use up the STASH!"

We are indeed fortunate to have Bonnie as a member, past president, good friend and a fellow quilter!

Bonnie was born in Bridgeport, Connecticut, but grew up in Milford, Ct. She is the oldest of 4 children, having 2 brothers and 1 sister.

Her Mom taught her to sew when she was 10 years old and Bonnie has been enjoying it ever since.


