Who's Who In The Guild

Rowena was born in Falls Church, Virginia, then moved to Washington, D.C. where her father had a repair garage and her mother a boarding house.

She grew up with 4 sisters and 1 brother. When she was 6 they moved back to Virginia where her father opened a grocery store. In 1937 her mother opened a Dry Goods store and kept that until 1960 when her brother took over. It seems retailing was in the family genes.

Rowena graduated from High School in 1946 and started working at various jobs starting with Army Map Service, the National Rifle Association and also the local telephone Company. She was married at the age of 19 and had 5 girls and 1 boy. She was divorced in 1959 and lived with her parents for 2 years until she got a job with the County Government.

Rowena's mother taught her to sew at an early age which came in handy later in life when she was able to make all her own clothes and the clothes for all 5 of her girls.

Her 2 oldest daughters, Pam and Diana still live in Virginia and her son works for Microsoft and lives in California. Her daughter Carol lives in Brandon, Florida and she lost her youngest daughter to lung cancer almost 11 years ago.

She finally retired from her position in County Government in 1985 and moved to Spring Hill.

She met Marge Crocker in 1989 in what was then the Fabric King and they both joined a quilt group at the Enrichment Center in Spring Hill. Two years later they both joined the Hernando Quilter's Guild when it was first formed in 1991.

Rowena has held several positions in the Guild in her many years as a member starting with Membership Chairman, 2nd Vice President (Education), Advertising Chairman, Nominating committee and she even did the fat quarter sales for several years. She's a "Worker Bee" and has made many quilts for charity through the years. Rowena is the type of person that if she finds that someone is in need, she always tries to do what she can to help. She has recently been taking food and clothing and some quilts over to a warehouse to help homeless families living in the woods off Spring Hill Drive. God will bless you Rowena!

We are very fortunate to have Rowena as a member, good friend and a fellow quilter!

Joyce was born in a small town in Texas about an hour from Abilene called Stamford. She was the youngest of two children and was actually raised by her mother, grandmother and great grandmother at the Lowe's Hotel, a small hotel owned and operated by her grandmother in the 1930's. She comes from a long line of sewers and quilters and was taught by her grandmother to crochet, embroider and quilt. Joyce's grandmother hand-crafted all the quilts used on the beds in the hotel rooms.

Joyce worked in the hotel while in High School and would come home at lunch time to feed her older brother who was born with downs syndrome. He passed away at the age of 21.

When she was 19 she joined the Air force and was stationed in Montgomery, Alabama where she elevated to the rank of Corporal and also met her husband of 58 years.

It was while Joyce was in the service that the hotel burned down and all those hand made quilts were destroyed in the fire. Luckily, Joyce still has some quilt tops that she calls her treasured heirlooms, made out of old dresses by her grandmother in well known patterns such as Texas Lone Star and Grandmother's Flower Garden to name a few.

After Joyce and her husband were discharged from the service they moved to Connecticut and later to a small town outside Poughkeepsie, New York called, Clinton Corners. It was there they raised 4 children and now have 7 grandchildren.

She has made many quilts through the years for all of them, but some have special meaning like the ones she would make every year to be auctioned off to raise funds for her granddaughter, Karrisa to go to summer camp for Juvenile Diabetes, a disease that contributed to her father's death at the age of 41 - Joyce's son-in-law.

She also prides herself in a very special quilt she made for her son-in-laws parents' 50th Wedding Anniversary called "Gathering Hearts." They treasure that quilt.

Joyce and her husband moved to Florida after his retirement and she joined the Hernando Guild around 1995.

Her life's ambition as she says, is to complete a double wedding ring quilt for each of her 7 grandchildren. She only has 3 more to make to complete her goal. How wonderful!

We are very fortunate to have Joyce as a member of our Guild, good friend and a fellow quilter!

IRISH SODA BREAD

- | | |
|------------------------------------|----------------------------------|
| 2 Cups un-sifted all-purpose flour | 3 Tbs butter |
| 1- 1/2 tsp baking powder | 1 cup buttermilk |
| 3/4 tsp baking soda | 2/3 cup raisins coarsely chopped |
| 1 tsp salt | 1 Tbs butter melted |
| 4 Tbs sugar | 1/4 tsp ground cinnamon |
| 1- 1/2 tsp caraway seeds | |

Prepare oven to 375 degrees. Grease 8" or 9" round layer cake pan. In a medium bowl, combine flour, baking powder, baking soda, salt and 3 tbs. sugar. Add butter and cut into flour with two knives or a pastry blender until butter is in fine pieces. Make a well in the center of flour mixture; pour in buttermilk and add raisins. Mix lightly.

Turn out onto lightly floured board and knead gently a few times. Shape into a 5" round loaf and place in prepared pan. Using a sharp knife or scissors, cut dough crosswise into quarters, about 1/3 of the way through. Brush top surface with melted butter and sprinkle with remaining 1 tbs sugar mixed with cinnamon.

Bake for 35-45 minutes until golden brown. Serve warm with butter.

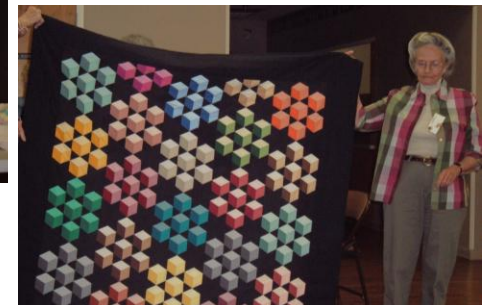
