- 2017 GUILD CHALLENGE "COLOR" As the winner of Best of Show of the 2016 Guild Challenge, Shirley Kerstetter has chosen the subject for the February, 2017 Challenge. The subject is "Color" The idea is to choose complementary colors from the color wheel (any two colors directly opposite each other on the color wheel. Example: (Blue and Orange). You may use shades of the colors of your choice. Solid, Moda type or tone on tone small print. The possibilities are endless with such a broad category. Get your creative juices flowing. We would like to have a large participation. 

Example: (Blue and Orange). You can only use two colors and also shades of the colors of your choice. Solid, Moda type or tone on tone small print. The possibilities are endless with such a broad category. Get your creative juices flowing. We would like to have a large participation. - **Categories:** Applique' (hand and machine in the same category*), Pieced (machine and paper in the same category*), Embroidered (hand and machine in the same category*), Mixed Technique and Wearable Art.
- **Judging:** Viewer's Choice in all categories for 1st, 2nd and 3rd and "Best of Show."
- **Quilting:** You must have hand or machine quilting on your quilt.
- Size: No smaller than 16x16" and no larger than 45x60". If you are smaller, or larger than the specifications, your quilt will not be judged.
- Due Date: February 23, 2017 Guild Meeting
- Rules: You are not allowed to use a quilt that has been made previous to this challenge. It must be made between February 25th, 2016 and February 23rd, 2017. There will be a sign-up sheet when you bring in your quilt to put your name on and which category your quilt is in. ALSO, you must have your name on the back of your quilt. No name, no judging.

* There must be 4 quilts in each category to be judged separately (example 4 hand appliqued and 4 machine appliqued). Otherwise, all appliqued quilts will be judged as one category.

Quilter's Corner

A Busy Quilter and Newsletter Editor

Barbara Theriault

Barb was born in Mt. Vernon, New York in Westchester County. At the age of two her family moved to Newburgh, a small town in the Hudson Valley. She was the oldest daughter having one sister and two brothers.

Barb's first introduction to sewing was at the age of 12 when she took lessons at the old Singer Company. She made a cotton dress which took 2nd place in her age group, winning a pair of really good sewing scissors. Her 2nd attempt was as a teenager when she tried to make a pair of slacks and sewed them together wrong, allowing no opening for each leg...ooops!

Her sewing took a back seat for a short time while she studied voice and was soloist for her Church, and enjoyed concert work throughout New York State including a special invite from the Postmaster General to sing the National Anthem with the Airforce Band at a dedication of the new Post Office in her home town. She was also the National Anthem soloist for all the sporting events during her high school years. One of her most memorable moments as a folk singer in the 60's, was performing with Pete Seeger and Don McClain to benefit the cleaning up of the Hudson River. The other was after high school when she was called by her old music teacher and asked to do a concert tour with the Mt. Saint Mary's College Chorus to San Juan Puerto Rico. She quickly accepted and sang an aria "Un Bel Di" from the Opera, Madame Butterfly. It was a very large audience and also, her first time on a plane. Talk about being nervous... but, she has loved flying ever since and an audience no longer intimidated her.

Barb married at 22 and after the stillbirth of her son and a failed short first marriage, met her present husband, Dick. They have been married for 40 years. She has four step children and 8 grandchildren. She raised the two boys full time and the girls in the summers, so her sewing resumed when she started making clothes for all four children – *pant legs correct this time!*

They moved about the country with promotions and job transfers, but spent most of their time in Chicago, then a transfer to Atlanta for Dick's job and Barb's job with General Mills in Trade/Marketing at the same time.

Her quilting addiction began in 1999 while living in Marietta, Georgia. She joined a Georgia Guild and learned a great deal from a very talented, experienced quilter. She entered a block contest for Wal-Mart for Children's Miracle Network and won first place with a teapot block, which was the inspiration for a later quilt she made for her Aunt called "Tea With Aunt Kate." Her quilt making was more selective then due to job demands and taking care of her aging parents.

Retirement and a move to Brooksville in 2006 brought her to the Hernando Quilters' Guild. She dug in with both feet and a year later in 2007, took over the Guild Newsletter. Her experience in sales/marketing publications made her a perfect candidate. Her quilt-making is very selective and projects are not completed as fast as the others because she likes to slowly design her own in many cases, and also spends a lot of time on the Guild Newsletter and correspondence for the Guild. At one time she was President of the Guild and Newsletter Editor at the same time! Deadlines keep her on her toes. Barb really enjoys the friendships she has made through quilting and hopes to continue for a long time to come! Pictured on the right are a few of her creations through the years.

Tips / Tricks/This & That

TIPS FROM QUILTERS AROUND THE COUNTRY

Selecting Fabrics

- Usually I choose a print first, then pick colors from the print to match the solids, or the smaller design prints I want to include. Betty Boyton -Gordonville, PA
- If I am working with a photo of a finished block or quilt, I try to match values (lightness and darkness), rather than trying to match fabrics or colors exactly. I achieve the same feeling as the quilt in the photograph, but I've made my own choices! Sue Seeley - New Bern, NC
- I look for fabrics with color combinations which are either opposite, or neighbors, on the color wheel. I vary the hues and values within these color choices. Elaine F. Asper, Stroudsburg, PA
- I go into a quilt shop with an open mind. I have found that if I go looking for a specific fabric or color, I spend twice as much time choosing fabric. Leslie Lott, Englewood, CO
- I choose fabrics without large open spaces in the prints. Too much open space can appear as a solid when the fabric is cut into small pieces. Faye Meyers, San Jose, CA
- For the quilt back, I am certain to use fabric of equal quality to the quilt top. If the backing is of a looser weave it is impossible to attain the finest quality quilting stitches, for even the most experienced quilter. I prefer to have enough fabric to allow for two seams on the back when it is not possible to have just once piece. With the panels being of equal size, it allows me to avoid having seams where folds are often made (the center), or where the quilt hits the edge of the bed, both of which hasten wear. Tips For Pressing

When ironing a large quilt top, or back, I put the iron on an extension cord and place two ironing boards end to end. I can work down the whole quilt at once. Barbie Mockenhaupt, Palmdale, CA
