The Hernando Quilters' Guild is doing their part in the fight against breast cancer by donating a pink and white guilt constructed by the guild members with the traditional colors representing the fight against breast cancer. The guilt was the brainchild of the VP of Programs for the guild, Ellie Fries.

Kim Garcia, the owner of Kim2bfit Performance & Wellness Studio in Spring Hill and her team called SWAT - "Strong Women Always Together," were the recipients of the quilt and will be participating in the 3-Day Tampa Bay Cancer Walk on Oct. 30th through Nov. 1st. The 60 mile walk will start at 6:00am on October 30th leaving from Sand Key Beach in Clearwater. Kim and her team of 10 women will represent Hernando County and have been training for this walk for several months in advance.

The donated quilt will be raffled off with all proceeds going in support of a cure for breast cancer. Ellie stated that the breast cancer guilt was received so well, it will probably become another annual undertaking of the guild.

Who's Who In The Guild







Emily Hamilton

When Emily was a small girl, she and her father were viewing the quilts at the Illinois State Fair in Springfield where she said that someday she would like to make quilts like those. Her father then remarked, "you'll never be able to sew like these old grandmothers." Her parents never worried about her self-esteem, but she says on the other hand, she never paid much attention to them and forged ahead with whatever she thought she could do.

Years later her future mother-in-law gave her some 30's fabric and started her on a Grandmother's Flower Garden quilt, which was years in the making because of its complexity. The blocks were finally completed with 50's fabric left over from her pregnancy days. The next 30 years were spent raising five children, teaching special education in Pasco County and just plain surviving.

Some women in her church started a quilting group where you brought your own projects to work on and eventually it turned into an eating and social gathering. As time went on she didn't learn very much, so she bought a book by Lori Yetmar Smith called "Learning To Quilt, A Beginner's Guide." This was a Sampler Quilt which began with the Rail Fence and ended with Goose Tracks. Emily bought her first coordinated fabrics and basic quilting supplies at JoAnn's and followed each page to the letter, which included quilting patterns for each block. In the years since that first attempt, she has found easier ways to make many of those blocks.

Emily later met Lois Fowler, a member of the Hernando Quilters' Guild who persuaded her to join and also invited her to the Christmas Party. It was there that she met Shirley Kerstetter. The earliest newsletter she received was from December, 1989 written by Terri Wessling and the President was Bonnie Staveski.

She says the Hernando Quilters' Guild has taught her so much as well as meeting so many wonderful women through the years who have come and gone. So many lasting friendships! She will always be grateful to Lois, who is no longer with us, for asking her to join.

Emily took over the newsletter from Terri and did it for seven years. She says "Talk of Your Labor Of Love." It was a major undertaking, but being involved in this group has brought her more blessings than one can imagine.

We are indeed very fortunate to have Emily as a member of our Guild, good friend and fellow quilter!

Muriel Johnson

Muriel is a native Floridian, born in Monticello with a bad aorta valve, and was pronounced dead three times before she was a year old. She had two older brothers at that time.

The family later moved to Clearwater for her health and that was where Muriel grew up. Another brother and one sister were added to the family after they moved to Clearwater.

Muriel graduated from Clearwater High School and then went on to business school. She says her first job paid a whopping \$3.50 per week, working 5-1/2 days.

In 1943 she went to Norfolk, Virginia and worked for the Army Corps of Engineers and while there she saw her first snowfall.

In 1944 she went to Washington, D.C. and worked for the Navy Department. It was there she met her husband. They were married in 1946. Her husband also worked for the Navy Department and then the Air Force.

When they would take vacations they would travel throughout the United States spending time collecting rocks that they later made into jewelry. When he retired in 1971, they moved to New Mexico, just south of Albuquerque, but after his death, she moved back to Florida to be near some of her family. Muriel now lives on 2-1/2 acres which she proudly states, she maintains herself.

She dabbled in ceramics, acrylic painting and oil painting. All the paintings on the walls in her house are her own artwork. She says somewhere along the line she took an interest in quilting and joined the Hernando Quilters' Guild. She made all the banners in the Gulf Ridge Park Baptist Church and also the Chrismans for the Christmas tree in the Church, which most of you viewed last year after our Christmas lunch. Such beautiful work. She also does machine embroidery.

Muriel is very active in the Guild and presently runs the "Block Of The Month."

In addition to her quilting, embroidery and artwork, she plays the organ and piano for her Church. She is a very talented lady and with all that talent, one could say that God definitely had plans for that little girl who had a rough beginning.

We are very fortunate to have Muriel as a member of our Guild, good friend and a fellow quilter!
