QUILTING HISTORY



Basket Medallion Quilt w/Scalloped Borders



Although the goal of quilt makers during the Colonial Revival was to go back to the styles of Early America they often missed the mark. But in the case of medallion quilts they came pretty close to emulating quilts actually made in Colonial America.

Central medallion style quilts were already popular in 18th century England. The English called them "frame" quilts as "medallion" is a later term. So as early as the 1700s women carried quilts of this style with them when they came to the New World. They also brought the patterns and skills needed to make them.

These quilts had a center focal point that might be a solid piece of fabric with an interesting print, an appliqued center or a larger pieced block. Pieced and/or appliqued borders surrounded this central medallion.

Leaders of the quilt revival of the early 20th century must have been inspired by examples of these early quilts as several, including Marie Webster, Rose Kretsinger and Ann Orr, not only made quilts in this style but also designed medallion style patterns for others. Their medallion quilts emphasized applique, especially with floral themes.

Although they were designed in the spirit of the older quilts the solid or near solid applique fabrics on broad expanses of white gave them a modern look.

Scalloped Borders and Binding Them

Although Marie Webster published her first quilt pattern with scalloped borders in 1912 it took until the 1920s for them to become really popular. These curved edges required bias binding. The quilt maker would have to cut the fabric strips on the bias unless she opted to use bias tape. This tape was available in many colors and widths from 1920 to 1940 though it was available much earlier. Unfortunately there is less choice in bias tape today in quality, color and width. So you may prefer to make your own bias strips.

You Know you are a Quilter If...

- There's more fabric in the house than food
- "Fat Quarters" are not the heaviest part of your body
- Your ironing board is always set up but you never iron clothes
- You think of your job as an interruption of your quilting time
- You pet fabric
- People are always picking threads off you
- ❖ You can measure a scant 1/4 by eye
- "Featherweight" doesn't mean boxer
- Your "UFO's" are not from outer space
- You clean up your sewing room & they think you are leaving!

Tips / Tricks / Recipes



TIPS FROM QUILTERS AROUND THE WORLD

Applique

- ❖ I like to blanket stitch with my machine around my appliqués, but hate to stop and start all the time. To avoid this I have found that I can blanket stitch around one piece, stop and lift the needle, change to a straight stitch and proceed around the edge until I have reached the next point where I again lift the needle and change back to the blanket stitch. It does not hurt anything to have those extra stitches, but it does eliminate all those threads that have to be tucked in on the back. Sandy in Idaho
- ❖ I like to applique but to applique onto a block draws it up and therefore it is no longer square. To counteract this I always cut my base block at least a half inch bigger than I want the finished block to be, then square it up after it is done. Ferrell in California
- When doing machine applique, use a lightweight thread in your bobbin. This will lessen the bulk, especially if you are using any type of stabilizer. Sue in Michigan
- When I work with small pieces for applique, I work on a rigid placemat I got at the dollar store - if I get glue on it, so what, and it's easy to carry the small threads left on it to the garbage. I wipe it clean when done and I'm ready for the next time. - Sharon in Montreal, Canada

99 - 2" squares

50 - 2 1/2" squares

42 - 3" squares

30 - 3 1/2" squares

20 - 4" squares

16 - 4 1/2" squares

12 - 5" squares

12 - 5 1/2" squares

9 - 6" squares

6 - 6 1/2" squares

Recipe Corner

Here are two recipes that will be nice for the holidays!

CRANBERRY MOLD

- 2 Pkgs Raspberry Jello
- 2 Cups boiling Water
- 1 Pint Sour Cream
- 1 Can Cranberry Sauce

Combine Jello and water. Let stand until thin jelly. (put in refrigerator, but watch closely so it does not jell). Fold in sour cream. Mash cranberry sauce with fork and add to mixture. Pour into lightly greased mold. Refrigerate.

SUGAR COOKIES

1 cup white sugar

1 cup powdered sugar

1 cup margarine or butter (I use butter)

2 Eggs

1 cup Oil

4 Cups flour – sifted with 1 tsp. salt

1 tsp baking soda

1 tsp Cream of Tarter

½ tsp nutmeg

1 tsp vanilla

Mix in above order. Chill 1 hour. Roll in balls. Press down with glass dipped in sugar. Bake 10 Minutes at 350 degrees. (May add 1 oz. melted chocolate and ½ cup flour for variation)






