I then mentioned that some of you had been asking me about the Dawn Center and donations, and that I did not have a contact number or person to let me know what they needed. What is needed at this time is diapers, non-perishable food items and gift cards. They do not need clothing at this time. If you wish to donate any of the above items, I will collect them and bring them to the Dawn Center. Another thing you might think about is when you travel and your collect all those small bottles of shampoo, soaps, conditioners, etc. you might want to bring them in for the Dawn Center.

- Baby Caps:** Knitted or Crouched for neonatal unit – See Ruth Redeker for info or patterns.
- Aluminum Tabs:** (off soda cans) used for Ronald MacDonald House – Give to Ruth Redeker.
- Labels for Education:** Labels off soup cans and from boxes, box tops for education – Give to Joyce Elliffe.
- Migrant Workers:** If you have food and clothing, especially long sleeve shirts, please bring them in. Give to Paula Lawery.

Tips For Quilters**Shopping For Fabric**

The key to easier fabric shopping is simple. Use a safety pin to attach fabric swatches to a key ring. You can carry your quilt-in-progress with you for those unplanned quilt shop stops!

Viewing Fabric

Make template windows of quilt block pieces from sturdy paper or cardboard and use them to preview fabric at the fabric store. Viewing a fabric through a template window can help you see what individual pieces look like more easily than by looking at a whole bolt.

Who's Who In The Guild

Sandy moved here to Spring Hill 13 years ago after living in Cincinnati, Ohio most of her life. She has been married to the love of her life for the past 7 years.

She has two sons. Her oldest son lives in Cincinnati and her youngest son lives in Germany where he is a Major in the U.S. Army.

Sandy considers herself a late bloomer because she started nursing college when she was in her 40's and spent most of her career as a Hospice Nurse.

She confesses, however, that her sewing has been a sore spot in her life. After taking Home Economics in Middle School, she vowed never to try it again!

The project was to make a skirt and blouse to model at the end of the year. She wore a size 14 at the time and by the time she had fixed all the mistakes and cut out the bad parts, much to her dismay, the skirt finished off at a size 2. Unfortunately, the blouse was even worse. It had 1 sleeve that puckered in the armpit. Needless to say, it was rather discouraging when she received a grade of a whopping "D" for effort.

About 4 years ago Sandy won a Bernina Sewing Machine which started her back on her life of crime against fabric.

She says Gene Chambers is her hero because she can sew and PAINT!!! She has patiently helped her with both hobbies.

Sandy's prayer and her goal, is to be a help and a blessing to the wonderful ladies in the guild.

We are indeed very fortunate to have Sandy as a member, our Vice President, good friend and a fellow quilter!

Eileen was born in Milwaukee, Wisconsin and was the 2nd child out of six children. Each one of her siblings was born in a different State because her parents were in the Army. Eventually, to raise their family, they bought 10 acres of land in the small town of Rome, Wisconsin with a population of about 350 people.

When she turned 18 years old she joined the Navy and served until she got married and became a Mom to her son Kevin, who is now 40 years old.

In 1969 she began working at Briggs & Stratton as a timekeeper. She was hired to replace a man who had broken his leg. 25 years later, she married that man. Her first marriage could not survive the loss of 4 children through miscarriage, or her husband's heart attack and quadruple by-pass surgery, which he had at the age of 35, so they divorced in 1983.

In 1988 Eileen became a volunteer firefighter for the Village of Menomonee Falls. What she didn't realize until she was in her first real fire, with full bunker gear on, was that at almost 42 years old she was actually more of a liability than an asset, so she turned in her badge and went on to "Greener Pastures."

In 1994 when the 40 below temperatures got the best of them, Tom and Eileen along with 24 close friends, boarded a plane to Elko, Nevada where they got married. Everyone returned there to re-celebrate every year for several more years. Today their blended family consists of 4 children, 13 grandchildren and 3 great grandchildren.

In 1996 after her sister lost her husband, they took a beginning Quilt Class and the "Quilting Bug" took hold.

In 1999 Tom and Eileen bought land here in Hernando County and she was hardly unpacked when she discovered the Hernando Quilt Guild. Eileen has been an active member ever since, including a two year term as President.

We are very fortunate to have Eileen as a member of our Guild, good friend and a fellow quilter!
